Improper use of equipment for tasks that the equipment was not intended, could create additional hazards resulting in injury or death	M	M	M	To ensure safe operation of farm and ranch equipment, it must be designed and built for the intended use.  Do not use equipment for tasks outside the specifications and certifications for which it was built, and where a safety hazard is identified for that use (for example, overloading beyond allowable weights)
