The <u>Injury Prevention Centre</u> compiles data from numerous sources to publish farm safety statistics. Using data on agricultural fatalities in Alberta between 1990-2013, they published the following infographics:



What do the statistics mean for you?

Statistics show us where our problems are and give us a chance to address them. If we know our daily use of tractors is contributing to a high amount of fatalities in agricultural operations in Alberta, and we know the exact cause are runovers and rollovers, then we can take preventative action in these areas to reduce the likelihood of experiencing a tractor-related incident.

Runover and Rollover Prevention

- Conduct a Hazard Assessment
- Look at things from every angle
- Consider who will be involved
- Put Control Measures in place
